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

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
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hanghai is a diverse and bustling city that is home to 26.32 million people.
Although there has been plenty of talk in the expatriate circle comparing the two sides of the Huangpu River to Manhattan and New Jersey, there is more than just two neighbourhoods to this vibrant city.

Xuhui District

Xuhui is one of the larger districts of Shanghai that is culturally significant. You can find cutting edge architecture just steps away from idyllic streets with charming European-style homes. There are plenty of boutique shops and artisan grocers which makes it very attractive for westerners to relax and hang out.

Xujiahui area in the center of Xuhui District is a bustling commercial business district that's home to Grand Gateway Plaza, St. Ignatius Cathederal, and Xujiahui Observatory. Another bustling business district is on Middle



Huaihai Road, which has mall IAPM and within close walking distance to Xintiandi in Huangpu District. On the eastern side of Xuhui District, you can find a vibrant art and culture scene at the West Bund. With beautiful riverside views of the Huangpu River and home to Long Art Museum, Shanghai Center of Photography, and Yuz Museum, this is also an up and coming neighborhood that is rising in popularity.

For living: For many foreign families, popular neighbourhoods to

reside in run from Changle Road and Huashan Road going south towards Hongqiao Road, alongside Hengshan Road. There is a mix of old lane houses and newer high storied apartment compounds. This district is accessible to major metro lines with notable metro stops of Xujiahui, South Shaanxi Road, Changshu Road, and Zhaojiabang Road.

Jing'an District

Jing'an District is the area surrounding Jing'an Temple. Here you can find modern high-rise apart-

ments and British-style old villas and lane houses. West Nanjing Road is one of the major commercial streets that runs through the district that is home to many international offices. Although Jing'an District is considered one of the smaller districts in Puxi, it is a lively spot to be in. And its central location is also one of the reasons why real estate property pricilng here is quite high.

Some highlights of Jing'an include the commercial area of Kerry Center, the Jing'an sculpture park, Natural History Museum, and the quiet idyllic neighbourhoods surrounding Suzhou Creek. Many families also reside in this district due to the proximity to entertainment and dining hot spots, plus you can find many kid-friendly activities in this area

For living: Living in Jing'an District is quite popular among the expa-

triate community, especially the area north of Jing'an Temple and in the area near Suzhou Creek. You will see many school buses from many international schools running through the area during pick up and drop off times. Apartments in Jing'an are mainly modern high rises and you can find serviced apartments as an option for accomodation if you have just arrived in town.

Another area to consider as an alternative near Jing'an is Putuo District (in the Changshou Road area, near Haifang Road).

Huangpu District

Huangpu District is a culturally diverse area that is home to some of the city's famous landmarks, the Bund and Xintiandi. Sprawling from Bundside to Middle Huaihai Road (where it borders Xuhui District), the area is full of glitzy shopping department stores and

fancy dining options. But that's not all. Here you will find a great mix of foreign-styled architecture, old shikumen-styled residences, and modern buildings.

Cultural highlights of this area include People's Park. You can spend days enjoying every facet the park has to offer, including its many museums. Towards the eastern side of the district, you will find yourself in the up and coming area of South Bund. This is projected to be another financial zone with many skyscrapers filling the skyline. If you are looking for quirky and fun, Tianzifang is an old shikumen neighbourhood turned boutique shopping area. There are plenty of restaurants and tourists in this area.

For living: You can find attractive housing in Huangpu District. Whether you want to live along the Bund for the beautiful river view or stay closer inland, the choice is yours to make. The Bund has plenty of newly built luxury housing. However, if you want to stay in a period home or in a lane house, it is also an option. People's Square is a convenient area as it's a massive transportation hub with many metro line connections that will take you to any part of the city. If you want something quieter, you can also consider Dapuqiao Road as it's mainly shorter high rises with residential neighbourhoods that are also good for families or Huaihai Road near Xintiandi with its luxury compounds.

Yangpu District

North of Huangpu District and directly above Hongkou District is Yangpu District. It is home to two of Shanghai's best universi-

For living: Many foreigners enjoy living in this area because of its proximity to the Hongqiao economic hub and international schools such as Yew Chung, SUIS and SCIS. In Hongqiao there is the Gubei neighbourhood where many Asian expatriates live, so there are plenty of specialty shops for Korean and Japanese groceries especially if you are looking for a particular ingredient. Hongmei Road is also famous for its entertainment street also known as laowaijie, which is an entertainment hub full of western restaurants and pubs for a relaxing night out.

ties, Fudan University and Tongji University. You will find many international students and teachers living in this area. The two bustling spots are Wujiaochang, which is where most university faculty and students reside. And Daxue Road, which is where many students enjoy hanging out.

Expat families will enjoy living here as it is a quite relaxed and easy-going neighbourhood, albeit a bit more localised. If you are looking for schools, the French and German school opened a campus here last year, so this will be a convenient commute for families with children enrolled there.

Changning District

Changning District stretches from downtown Shanghai to the suburbs. You can expect bustling areas around the central business district surrounding Zhongshan Park and also the popular neighbourhood Gubei. Changning
District is also home to Changfeng
Park, which also has an underwater aquarium. And, moving southward within the district, it also includes another part of Hongqiao
Town (which overlays with Minhang District), which is home to the Hongqiao International Airport and the bustling Hongqiao economic hub. In Hongqiao you can find The Shanghai Zoo and plenty

Minhang District

Minhang is where a lot of international schools and universities set up their campus. Here you can find many residential neighbourhoods, as well as the site of many factories and production facilities.

For living: As an expat, you may consider residing near and around Hongmei Road or in Huacao Town since it is in close proximity to the international schools.





There are many international schools in this area: British International School Puxi Campus, Nord Anglia Chinese International School, Shanghai American School (Puxi campus), Shanghai Japanese School Hongqiao (elementary school campus), Shanghai Korean School, Shanghai Singapore International School (Minhang campus), Dulwich College Shanghai (Puxi campus). There is also the campus of Jiaotong University and East China Normal University.

Qingpu District

Located in the western part of Shanghai, it spans from East Xujing (next to the Hongqiao International Airport) to Zhujiajiao watertown and Dianshan Lake. This is a great option for housing. It is quieter than in-city living, but it's easy to get to city centre via metro line 2 or 17.

The French and German School. Western International School of Shanghai and International Philippines School of Shanghai are also

located in the Qingpu District. And, it is not a far drive away from Minhang District.

Pudong New Area

On the opposite side of Puxi on the eastern side of the Huangpu River is Pudong New Area. This area is massive and it comprises everything from a world-recognized financial district, industrial zones and free trading zone, Waigaoqiao. It has a wildlife zoo, fruit picking farms, and Disneyland! This sprawling space has plenty of residential areas for you to choose from.

If you need to be in a central location, Lujiazui can be a viable option. It has modern skyscrapers, international shopping, and worldfamous hotels. Expats who work in the area can live in one of the large compounds with onsite facilities like swimming pools, club houses, and gyms. Pudong Avenue is also a mix of residential and commercial areas as well as Century Park. Jinqiao and Biyun (also known as Green City) are very popular neighbourhoods for expatriate families. Kanggiao is also a great neighbourhood as it is home to many international schools.



International School Curriculums at a Glance

Learn the lingo of high school curriculum. By Abbie Pumarejo

hen choosing an international school for your child, families should consider the bigger picture and whether they will be returning home or if another international move is in their future. To help parents in selecting the appropriate curriculum for their child, here is a quick guide.

International Baccalaureate

International Baccalaureate
Organization (IB) offers programmes at four different levels:
PYP (Primary Years Programme,
ages 3-12), MYP (Middle Years Programme, ages 11-16), DP (Diploma
Programme for secondary school,
ages 16-19) and CP (Career-related
Programme).

- The IB programme encourages students to think critically and independently, with inquirybased tasks. IB Diploma candidates will focus on six individual topics for graduation of secondary school.
- IB Diploma graduates, depending on their final test scores, can have classes taken applied to university credits. However, it is important to do your due diligence, as each university will have different policies about credit transfers.
- This European-based diploma certification is recognized worldwide.

Advanced Placement

Advanced Placement (AP) is a program developed and administered by the College Board, the organization responsible for the SAT (formerly known as the Scholastic Aptitude Test), allowing students to obtain college credits while still in high school.

- AP classes give students the experience of an introductory level college class that qualifies learners for more advanced classes upon entrance to North American colleges.
- Nearly all American and Canadian universities accept AP scores for credit. Again, it is important to do research, as each university will have different policies about credit transfers.
- It is not a two-year requirement compared to the IB Diploma programme or A-Levels.
- It is an American-based diploma certification recognized mainly in the USA and select universities worldwide

IGCSE

The International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) is a British curriculum which prepares students for the IB and A-Level examinations. English language is the heart of the curriculum, ensuring students' ability to communicate fluently in the world's most widely spoken language.

- The IGCSE programme is a precursor to A-Level, AP, and IB certification, and is completed in the first two years of high school.
- It is an exam-based curriculum that tests the knowledge of individual subjects, awarding one IGCSE qualification for each successful subject exam.
- There are three types of board exams for the IGCSE: Cambridge IGCSE, Pearson Edexcel International GCSE and Oxford AQA.
 They all take place during different times of the year.

A-Levels

A-Level exams are subject-based qualifications achieved as part of the General Certificate of Education (GCE) offered in the UK curriculum courseware. This is particularly relevant for students in secondary schools.

- A-Levels are required for university entrance, and conditional acceptance by UK post-secondary institutes are based on students' grades.
- Students can expect to take three A-Levels in order to obtain offers from various universities, and most pick courses based on their desired degree.
- Many of the higher-level degree subjects do require specific A-Levels for acceptance to the programme, so it is important to research university requirements before starting the programme.



Paying for School Fees

Parents financially plan for education. By Lynn Yen

ound financial planning is important for any person, but it becomes especially so once you have dependants, your lovely kids. Those cute, small humans require money, and one of the biggest expenses can be education.

If you have your eyes on a private international school, be ready to pay up. The school fees in Shanghai are among the most expensive in the world, with average yearly prices for pre-kindergarten or nursery at 165,055 RMB (US\$25,300), increasing up to 281,110 RMB (US\$43,000) for the final years of high school.

Of course international schools aren't the only option for education. There are fee paying bilingual schools, which fall in the 100,000 to 200,000 RMB range, and local public schools with international curriculum departments, which cost below 100,000 RMB. Some families even opt for home schooling.

I talked to three Shanghai families with young kids to see how they approach financial planning and paying for school fees.

There was a time when recieving expat benefits was more commonplace. This all-inclusive relocation

package, paid by big multinational employers, includes school fees on top of housing and medical insurance. A smaller portion of the international community is on this package now. Of the three families Italked to, one is an entrepreneur, and two out of three don't receive funds from their employer to pay for education.

For Pay, her husband's company gave them a price range for school fees. She hadn't thought about school fees until her first child was getting old enough to attend school, and counts her family lucky that the company agreed to cover school fees, including prekindergarten. With the recent birth of her second child, she'll be having that conversation again.

She and her husband have always saved for the lifestyle they wanted, and that future included multiple kids, plus their schooling costs.
Upon the arrival of kids, Pav and her husband chose to enrol in life insurance. Their family utilize financial planners at St. James Place to help with expat status and investments in the UK, and Standard Chartered out of Singapore for Asia-based investments.

The family has lived in Shanghai for over four years, and forsee themselves staying another three to five years. Pav says that if they were to move any where else in Asia, where she grew up, a school package would be a big deciding factor. If her financial situation changed to a point where the family's saving ability would take a hit from paying for school fees, Pav would consider other options such as changing schools.

Paty, another parent, has been in Shanghai for six years and hopes her husband's employer, a small import company, can contribute to education fees in the future for her three-year-old. She said she would discuss with the company before having a second kid. Like Pav, Paty also didn't think about school fees as a big expense until her daughter was born.

Planning for the next few years, Paty thinks a British international school would be great for elementary school and beyond, but she is also looking into public schools and their international departments for her daughter, prioritising language as well as cost.

The family doesn't have plans to move, but is unsure how long their Shanghai journey will end up running.

In addition to budgeting and saving every month, Paty has income from property abroad the family could tap into for covering primary and secondary school fees if needed. With the economic impact of COVID-19, she knows the situation could be worse. She suggests to expecting parents that they speak to their employer about an education package.

Greg, founder and executive of a food and beverage company, has known since early on that he would settle in China and raise a family. He has lived here since 2008, and therefore knew the high living costs of Shanghai, including the price range of international school fees. Greg started saving early for the life he envisioned,

long before his daughter entered the picture. He considers himself financially literate, and does his own finances and investments. School fees are something his family plans to pay for out of pocket, and are now incorporated as a line item in their budget.

Still, he was shocked by the intensity of pre-kindergarten admissions. His daughter is two years old, but Greg found the research, school visits, cost, and competitive admission application process to be comparable to getting into college.

A determining factor in financial planning is how long families see themselves living in Shanghai.

Another major factor is whether or not employers cover school fees.

With an early, clear idea of the future, it's easier to estimate cost of living and to plan for a desired type of lifestyle for both parents and kids.



Protect Your Children from Sports Injuries

Learn how to prevent, identify, and treat sports injuries from a Columbia Kaiyi Clinic physician.



■ here's no denying that physical exercise is benefical to children, but it can also cause injuries. Parents can help children enjoy physical exercise while avoiding injury. To address this challenge, Dr Kyle Xiong, a rehab physician from Shanghai Bainuo and Yihui Clinics and a father of two daughters, offers real-life suggestions on how to avoid injury during physical exercise.

What are the main causes of post-exercise injuries?

Cause 1: Lack of basic sporting knowledge, irregular exercise methods, lack of musice tone

If children do not have enough technique in certain sports, and do insufficient exercise, then these

wrong techniques put an added load on a certain parts of the body. When the load exceeds the limits that their bodies can handle, different kinds of injuries will occur.

Cause 2: No injury prevention training nor proper warm-up before the exercise

Children don't know how to properly warm up and protect themselves from injury, and therefore lack the awareness and ability to protect themselves. If there isn't a proper warm-up beforehand, injuries are bound to occur.

Cause 3: Personal reasons, ill-fitting clothing, unprofessional venue and equipment

Each child has a different physical condition, like tight muscles, weak joints, or especially scoliosis, which can easily lead to injury during exercise. In addition to their own physical conditions, ill-fitting clothing and unprofessional venue and equipment can all cause injuries.

The doctor suggests: Teach children the correct way of exercising. increase exercise time to strengthen muscle tone and pay attention to warm-ups. Warm-up exercises are especially necessary before high-intensity sports with running, jumping, and some other competitive sports.

When these signs occur, it's most likely a sports injury

Scenario 1: After exercise, the child's muscles are in constant and intense pain

It's probably a pulled muscle. Muscle pull is a relatively common sports injury. If you do not warm-up before exercising or if you exercise too much, this may lead to different degrees of muscle pull. In its early stages, the injury will lead to swelling and pain in the joint area, preventing the patient from moving as usual.

Scenario 2: After exercise, the child's joint area continues to have severe pain, and can't move as usual

This is most likely a partial sprain or even dislocation. Exercise may lead to sprains or even dislocated joints with sudden and improper movements. Such injuries will cause pain and swelling symptoms in certain areas.

The doctor suggests: Usually, muscle soreness and pain caused by general non-sports injury won't last very long. Just let the child rest for a while. If the child is in severe pain or pain lasts longer than three days, which is commonly referred to as the "golden 72 hours", then parents must pay attention and bring the child to the hospital ASAP.

"Growing pain" and "sports pain" are really different

Because children and adolescents have a high tolerance for sports injury, it is easy to ignore or misdiagnose an injury. Due to the lack of awareness of sports injuries, it is very easy to mistake the pain as "growing pain" and be ignored by parents when children complain about their joint pain. But in fact, it is easy to tell the difference

between "growing pain" and "sports pain". "Growing pain" is mostly due to children's relatively large amount of physical activity and fast-growing bones and joints. The pain of a sports injury however, usually only appears on one side of the leg during walking and other movement, and the pain is alleviated while at rest.

The doctor suggests: When the child complains about pain, the parents should encourage him or her to point out the degree, frequency, and duration of pain, so that parents can make a prejudgement and decide if the child should go to the hospital for further examination and treatment.

How can parents immediately deal with a sports injury?

When children have sports injuries, make sure they receive proper treatment to prevent further aggravation, and minimize the damage. The mainstream treatment of sports injuries is the "POLICE" principle.

"P" refers to Protection. Stop the child from moving immediately to protect the injured part from further injury.

"OL" refers to the Optimal Loading. Early strength stimulation during treatment and rehabilitation must use the appropriate weight load for recovery.

"I" refers to Ice, which is usually applied within 72 hours in the early stages of injury to reduce swelling and pain. Remember,

don't use hot stuff!

"C" refers to Compression. In the event of injury, the affected area needs to be wrapped up as soon as possible for professional medical treatment as well as to reduce swelling and bleeding.

"E" refers to Elevation, which is conducive to the deswelling of the injured area.

The doctor suggests: The "POLICE" principle is the general treatment for acute injuries, which need to be taken seriously and treated differently than other kinds of sports injuries. In addition to these treatments, it is very important that the injured person should be sent for professional medical treatment and rehabilitation as soon as possible.

Let's hope all children can enjoy sports freely without getting injuries.

hen was the last time you took a first aid course? Yep... I thought so. Unless mandated by your company you probably haven't been to one for ages. The thing about first aid is you always hope and pray you never need it. If you do though, it needs to be a gut reaction, something you can do while the adrenaline is pumping, $which \, is \, especially \, the \, case \, when \,$ it's one of your children that is hurt. So, what do you need to know? And when should you zoom straight to the hospital.

First, remember that prevention remains the best cure.

Get routine medical and preventive care from a family doctor. Getting necessary immunisations and treating minor illnesses before they get serious and can minimise visits to the emergency department.Learn how to recognise emergency warning signs.

Some warning signs of a medical emergency include (but are not limited to) difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, chest or upper abdominal pain or pressure, fainting, sudden dizziness, weakness or change in vision, confusion or change in mental status, sudden severe pain, bleeding that won't stop, severe or persistent vomiting, coughing up or vomiting blood, suicidal or homicidal feelings.

Know where to get help

In Shanghai, the emergency numbers you must know are: 120 - Ambulance 110 - Police 119 - Fire Brigade And, you should know the number of a 24-hour hospital. It is a good idea to keep these numbers in a

practical place, such as posted to

your fridge and in your mobile phone contacts.

ICE contact

Save a number in your phone under ICE or In Case of Emergency, this can be your spouse, your best friend or someone you trust. For your children make sure your number is saved in their phone under this as well as 'Mum' or 'Dad' to ensure you're the first person called if you're not on the scene.

Have enough cash on hand

Most hospitals in Shanghai now take Alipay or WeChat Pay but have cash just in case. In local hospitals (which you might have to go to if they are closest in a real emergency) you need to pay a fee before you are seen, and it's best to have enough cash to cover it. Have a few hundred RMB stashed in your wallet or phone case at all times, and have the option to eas-



ily draw out more.

In an emergency situation

Get the patient to the closest emergency room.

Ambulances in Shanghai are run by the Shanghai Medical First Aid Centre (also called the Shanghai Ambulance Center). Medical transport vehicles are based throughout the city and there is a 24-hour dispatch centre. People using the ambulance service must pay the driver in RMB cash upon arrival at the hospital. In general, you can request the ambulance to take you to a specific hospital. To call an ambulance, dial 120 and provide the call centre with your information. It is best to have someone who speaks Chinese with you.

Often, taking a cab or getting your driver to take you to an E.R. might be better than calling an ambu-

lance, considering the time it takes an ambulance to arrive at your location and then drive you to the Emergency Room—it's also generally cheaper.

Never move anyone who is unconscious or has struck their head or been injured in a car crash.

It is recommended to keep the injured person still until help arrives unless he or she is in danger. In case of injury, wait for the ambulance to arrive at your location.

Learn what to do until help arrives

First aid skills are important, especially when dealing with children. Knowledge of CPR, what to do when someone is chocking, or how to manage shock or handle fractures until emergency help arrives is very valuable. Consider

first aid training for your ayi, driver, and yourself.

When treating burns, just use cold water. Don't use ice or butter or petroleum jelly or toothpaste. If burns blister, are large (bigger than the palm of the victim's hand) or deep, get immediate medical help.

If a person has a cut, hold a clean towel (not tissue or kitchen roll) to the cut and try to stop the bleeding, if there is a foreign object, like glass, in the wound, do no remove it.

Emergencies are not ideal, but they do happen. The best thing you can do is use your common sense and book yourself to take a first aid course.

Over the years, the use of palm oil has done huge damage to rainforests around the world. At Dulwich College Shanghai Puxi, we are committed to sustainability, so I started a campaign to remove palm oil from our restaurant. I met with the restaurant staff, and proposed some alternatives to using palm oil for cooking. Eventually, they agreed to use substitutes which were more sustainable. We now have a palm oil free menu in our restaurant."



Winnie, Y13 The Peace Centre (TPC) is a home for orphaned children situated in Southwest Uganda. With a vast number who are double orphans with no immediate family, most of the children are behind in school because they have not been able to afford the fees. Dulwich College Shanghai Pudong has a long standing relationship with TPC. Our service trip to Africa to support TCP was truly an unforgettable experience. The communitu welcomed us into their culture, and from singing together, reading to them as they made us friendship bracelets or walking them to school, I will treasure those friendships forever."

Student agency is a core tenet of the Dulwich educational philosophy and we strongly believe that authentic global citizenship is enabled when we empower our students to take action on the causes they are passionate about. We are excited to see what new ideas can be formed when our students feel valued and supported to stand up and make a difference.

Over the last few months I have designed and produced a range of apparel from materials that would normally be thrown away. It's been a real team effort with students involved in procuring materials and producing the clothes. low students to make a difference."



Preparing for College

Starting the college conversation. By Lynn Yen

or those under age 18, you have probably been told that your full time job is being a student. A big project in this decades-long job is applying for, getting into, and graduating from college. It's the achievement most teenagers work towards their whole secondary school career, and it can be daunting. The topic of college is seemingly on the tip of every educator and parent's tongue. Preparing for college is a big decision in the life of students. So how should you approach it?

Patrick Love, a college counsellor at Concordia International School Shanghai, answered our questions about preparing for college. Here is what he had to say about shepherding students through this important phase.

Concordia starts talking to students about higher education once they enter high school. The conversations focus on the student's interests, strengths, and future career goals. Importantly, identifying these can help in selecting majors and colleges. But deciding when to bring the college subject up at home comes down to individual families and students.

"We touch on it [college planning] with students in 9th and 10th grades.

We then go more in depth in 11th and then 12th grades, as students begin to accumulate the work that will be part of the applications they send into colleges.

At Concordia, in the annual 1-on-1 reflection and planning meetings that we do starting in grade 9, we have students reflect on their strengths and interests. They can then identify a range of college majors where they might be able to go deeper yet into those areas. Counsellors can then give them some suggestions of colleges that would be strong in the area that they might want to pursue."

Don't fret if your student doesn't have strongly defined interests or a clear idea on careers, they have time to discover and decide.

"It's actually quite common for students to go to college while being "undecided" about their major. Additionally, one piece of research I've read said that two-thirds of students who think they have a major selected before starting college actually change their minds and pursue something else. Whether a student is sure they know what they are going to do, or have no idea, I think it's important to keep going deeper into current interests, exploring, and further developing skills and knowledge that will help them to be successful in the next step in their lives."

Outside of what subject to major in, other factors to consider are the unique characteristics of each university such as social life, student body makeup, location, teaching style, and financial costs that make for a better or worse fit

"College 'fit' can be a little bit hard to define because it is a little bit different for everyone. Generally speaking, fit is made up of a range of social, academic, and financial factors.


We encourage students to visit college campuses and get a feel for the student body. Ideally we want students to feel like they will be appreciated, and that they look forward to spending the next four years with the students on that campus. Academically, students need to find a place that matches their learning preferences and where they will be provided with opportunities that will successfully prepare them for the future. Financially, the schools where a student applies need to fall within the budgetary realities or goals of their family."

When you start researching schools and their differing application requirements, online resources such as virtual school tours are useful. Additionally, high school counsellors are seasoned in

college admissions and have accumulated a wealth of information.

"Ispend a lot of time talking to college reps about the application procedures they use, and how my students would go about applying. I also keep a spreadsheet that lists all the countries that my students apply to, and websites that contain key information on how to research schools, majors, and application procedures. One resource for US institutions is bigfuture.collegeboard.org. It contains both college and career research tools."

Applying for college is an important event, but it doesn't have to be overly painful. There are many resources at a student's disposal from family, friends, school teachers and counsellors, online resources, and even college admissions agencies. It's good to keep in mind that there isn't a definitive right or wrong choice or path. So arm youself with information and give it your best effort.





aking a gap year was not initially part of my 10-step plan to adulthood, but here I am, living through my "free" year as I gear up for university. For many of us, it is hard to talk about our year without referring to the obstacle that masked us from living 'normally'. It's safe to say, if it hadn't been for COVID-19, I would have bid my farewells to Shanghai and would have probably been crying over my midterms right about now. Although it was a decision forced upon me, I do not regret taking time away from school and $would\, recommend\, it\, to\, every\, high$ school senior.

Putting yourself out in the real world before you commit to a specific major allows you to explore your interests. It serves as an internal checklist, making sure you're studying what you want to. Getting job experience gives you an insight into your desired career

and the bonus of putting it on your resume. Shanghai Family was that platform for me. I was able to expand my current interests through a real-life simulation before entering the job market. While I interned at Shanghai Family, I was able to experience the life of an editor and an illustrator. The time I spent at the office taught me the value of my skills and the importance of socialising with people outside of my comfort zone. I do believe this will benefit me when I attend art school soon. Find something that really resonates with who you are as a person, and that will be the push you need when you're feeling down.

Now, I would drop everything and travel to Seoul for three months for a study program, had it been any other year. Although I wasn't able to, I encourage others to not miss out on the opportunity to travel and study abroad. Getting out of

vour comfort zone allows vou to grow and teaches you independence, which will help you for the rest of your life.

Want to learn to build an app? Or learn a language but never found the time? A gap year is perfect to indulge and explore beyond current interests. It is consequential to keep an open mind and exude selfawareness. Without teachers. counsellors, or essentially school. it is easy to get side-tracked and lose motivation. 2020 taught me the significance of adaptability. It is important to be self-disciplined as each activity one undertakes helps to build you. I recommend getting out of your comfort zone, socialising, and getting experience in your field and work that ignites the passion in you.

It's ironic as the name, a gap year, isn't missing out on life but a chance to enhance yourself as an individual.



What Differentiates a Bilingual School?

An updated look at bilingual schools. By Lynn Yen

he use of two languages,
Mandarin and English, for
classroom instruction is the
bilingual school calling card.
But looking beyond language, this
type of school in Shanghai is a
whole category on its own. One
that has undergone recent
changes to curriculum and admission policies.

In the Classroom

A bilingual school, or *shuangyu xuexiao* is a school that offers various national curriculums with teaching instruction done in both Mandarin and in English. So your IB Primary Years Programme science class will be in Mandarin one day and English on another.

Students of all backgrounds take the same classes together. Differing from some public schools with foreign departments that host the foreign curriculum sections in separate classrooms, all students at bilingual schools are mixed together and attend the same classes.

Types of Curriculum

Both domestic and foreign curriculums are offered at bilingual schools such as Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, British Columbia, International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE), and Advanced Level (A-Level) secondary school

curriculums that set students up to attend college abroad.

Bilingual schools also offer the Chinese National Curriculum that prepares students to take the rigorous Chinese college entrance exam, called the *gaokao*, and attend college domestically. Others offer a mix to keep both foreign and domestic higher education open to students by preparing them for all options.

Recently there were changes to private school curriculum requirements for Chinese passport holders. Now, all Chinese nationals regardless of school are required to take the same civics classes that are taught at public school, along with sitting the national education exams at Grade 5 and 9. The curriculum requirements affect up to Grade 9, the cap for mandatory schooling, and don't affect high school.

Every school's curriculum varies, so contact the school for details.

Admissions Process

Bilingual schools are open to Chinese and foreign passport holders alike. These are private schools, so they fall under changes announced in fall 2019 related to private school entrance requirements, which International Schools are exempt from.

For prospective students, when the number of applicants exceeds the number of spots available, applicants are entered into a randomized lottery to determine who gets in. This applies to all, regardless of nationality, and is used during normal admission times for entering elementary school at Grade 1 and middle school at Grade 6.

Though, every school's admissions process varies, so contact the school to learn more details.

Easing the Transition to School

First steps outside the nest. By Anabela Mok



t may take your child some time to adjust to their new environment at school, especially if it is their first time being away from mummy and daddy. How do you aid your child's transition to school life?

Communicate

You may not know it, but kids understand if you explain. Let them know what happens after drop off and what they can expect to do at school. FOMO (fear of missing out) can also ignite separation anxiety because they may miss spending the day with you. So you can also share with them what you will be doing when they are in school. Keep the conversation open and remember to highlight the positive experiences they can expect.

Role Play

Use their world of make-believe to role-play the drop off scenario. You can walk away from your child like you are saying bye at drop off and

return to your child by saying "hello, I am back!". In many ways, it's like peek-a-boo. You can also use their favourite dolls to play pretend, such as practice asking to go to the bathroom, or show them how you will hug them when you see them later in the day.

A Piece of Home

Let them feel they have a choice by allowing them to select a stuffed animal or a toy to bring to school. This will be important if they need some comforting during the middle of the school day when they miss you. This will also groom their behaviour for packing their own school bag when they are older.

Be Part of Their School Life

If you have photos from the day's activity via the school parent group, share those with your kid. Ask about the names of their new friends, their teachers, and learn about their favourite activity. You

can also use the opportunity to ask about their lunchtime and naptime. Ask what their teacher did with them that day. Be involved. stay engaged in their life.

Teacher Relations


Develop a relationship with your child's teacher. Try to do a brief catch up at least once a week to see how your child is developing. Do not be afraid to show up at pick up a few minutes early just to catch up and have a look at the classroom and how your child is adjusting to the new environment. It is also a great opportunity to get some face $time\ with\ the\ other\ parents\ or\ ayi.$

Step-by-Step

Before sending our child to fulltime school, I also enrolled her in daycare so she is able to have a few hours to be with friends in an environment without a parent. As the date got closer to proper school, I also added more days to the nursery so she became adjusted to the Monday to Friday schedule. Goodbyes were tough, but it got us started on a routine.

After School Routine

As a working mum, it is mission impossible to rush out of work to make school pick up, especially if I am coming from across town. But this is one part of the day I cherish more than anything. Having a nice after school routine gives a great positive enforcement that mummy is here to pick up (as promised). Of course there will be some after school activities like dance or music class, which I gladly join if she asks.

y kid's six. He wants to play with me, but I can only play Ninja Turtles for so long. I just don't have the energy. I work hard, and I'm tired. Plus, I'm a grown man. So, I kind of want to do grown man stuff, like lay back on my sofa and read (potentially pint-in-hand). When tasked with doing an art project with my kid, all tired and disheveled from work, I naturally thought, "this might suck".

That said, I like to deliver, and hanging out with Nesta (my kid) is actually pretty fun. So, I tried to think of something engaging, stress free, and something I could do at home.

We tried baking brownies. Brownies can be art. I mean...ours weren't. But they could've been. We pretty much wrecked that one straight out the gate. Unlike the TV commercials, where a spot of batter on the nose charms the kid into the arms of his loving parents, my kids' clothes were wrecked, my shirt was wrecked, and my tiny Jing'an kitchen was in shambles. The

"icing on the cake", I mixed-up my Fahrenheit to Celsius conversion, and burned my brownies into a crusty black shell, filled with a gooey inside. I somehow managed to both burn, and under-cook them at the same time. Didn't even know that was possible. We still ate them. No one complained. Respect.

Given my culinary prowess, it was an ambitious move. After getting our "just desserts", we moved on to a more successful endeavor. We threw on some 90's hip hop, pulled out a big piece of poster-paper, and just went to town with markers. Kids like to draw. Kids like drawing even more with their parents. Nesta could've done that all night.

Now, I know when we think of an art project we often want to go all out. Pull out some key learning outcomes and maximize creative output. Fair enough. Our poster project was pretty layman. But it did tick a few boxes. It let us work sideby-side, while giving us both ample space to be comfortable. We had enough space on the paper to expand our ideas and explore our

creativity. It was a joint activity, in that we were both contributing to a single project, and we got to merge our ideas into one, which was pretty cool. There were also no wrong answers.

I encouraged fine

motor skills, like colouringinside the lines and stuff. But in terms of actual content, his art is his art. Obviously, we can help our kids refine their ideas, and help them expand on them, but whatever the final output, it's still correct. Or at least not wrong. Like, you can't mess up a poster to the extent of which it's burnt on the outside and raw on the inside And while rules and step-by-step instructions certainly teach our kids discipline and structure, the rawness of attacking a giant poster-paper with colours and ideas is a joyous, free-form way to interact creatively with your kid. I definitely recommend it. Plus it's an easy clean up. SE





lanning for your child's education takes a lot of time and research. As a mum, I recently went through the process of deciding the best programme for my daughter. With so many top international schools as an option, the decision can be tough. How do you find the right early education programme for your child? Can these programmes provide both a fun environment while focusing on their development skills? When is it too early to begin planning their formative years of development? What should you look for when it comes to selecting an early years education program, and how important is play-based learning?

Why play engagement is crucial to learning.

One education curriculum that is gaining momentum in the early years is play-based learning. This approach encourages learning in a playful manner. Children can explore, experiment, discover, and solve problems in their own way. This all creates a learning environment where the child initiates learning, and teachers play a supportive role.

What is play-based learning?

Play-based early years programmes focus on open-ended free play. Both have benefits for children's learning. To capitalise on these benefits, an optimum play-based programme will provide opportunities for both free play and guided play. Sensory activities develop motor skills, and opportunities to play freely with other children sets the basic foundation for social development.

Playing supports positive attitudes to learning. These include the development of imagination, curiosity, enthusiasm, and persistence. The skills fostered in play cannot be replicated through traditional learning. Research in the field of early childhood has shown that play-based learning holds a higher efficacy in primary school programs.

What is the interaction between the teacher and student like?

Learning from playing encourages the child to explore and discover. And this motivates the child to gain mastery over their environment, promoting focus and concentration, especially sensory play. It also enables the child to adapt to different surroundings and people.

Although the child has the freedom to play with the activities and tovs preselected by the teacher. the teacher can pose questions

that encourage problem solving, predicting, and hypothesising. The teacher's role brings the child's awareness to mathematics, science, and literacy concepts, allowing them to engage through tactile exploration.

How does play translate to secondary learning?

Play-based programmes are helpful in building important literacy skills. Quality play helps a child understand the complexity of language and the learning process. In a private curriculum like Montessori, students choose which activities they are interested in and move at the pace that fits their own learning preferences. Reggio Emilia uses open play and learning by inquiry to allow students to discover and draw conclusions based on their hands-on activities. Even in a state curriculum, quality play is essential in EYFS and Early Learning Goals developed by the United States allowing children to develop the motor and socialisation skills for confidence building.

Understanding the Montessori philosophy

Montessori is a method of education based on self-directed activity and children are encouraged to learn by touching, feeling and doing. Montessori children are encouraged to move around the classroom and engage with the wide variety of activities available. They choose the activity they want to work on, bring it to a table or mat, explore the materials and make discoveries for themselves.

Montessori environment

A Montessori classroom is characterized by providing an environment that is tidy and simple. This prepared environment offers the

child opportunities to commit to interesting and freely chosen work, which brings out long periods of concentration that should not be interrupted.

The classroom also integrates children of mixed ages spanning three years. This promotes socialisation, respect, and solidarity among them naturally. When learning in a multi-age classroom, children are not labelled according to their ability, but rather able to learn at their own pace. With learning experiences tailored to them as individuals, they are able to take charge of their learning. This self-direction helps set the foundation for lifelong learning.

In this environment, children make creative choices in their learning, while the classroom and the highly trained teacher offer age-appropriate activities to guide the process.

Deep dive into the Reggio Emilia approach

The Reggio Emilia Philosophy values the child as strong, capable, and resilient. This philosophy

believes children are naturally curious, and uses this element to help children understand the world they live in.

Children in Reggio settings are active constructors of knowledge, who are encouraged to be 'researchers'. Most of the educational experiences within Reggio take the form of projects, where children have opportunities to actively participate, explore, and question things. There is also a very strong emphasis on the social development of children as part of the community and their relationships to other children, their families, and teachers.

The Reggio environment

A Reggio-inspired environment is open and free-flowing. It allows undisturbed exploration, play, and learning. Outdoor spaces are valued just as highly for education as formal classrooms, and the design of the space should allow children to move freely between the two. Children have access to toys and games, as play is an important element in their development. Also, the open space is conducive to



group projects where they are observed by teachers and the children are allowed to question the topic of interest.

How do I know if my child is ready for school?

School readiness refers to the knowledge, skills, and behaviours that will help a child participate and succeed at school. Sometimes parents may think that school readiness involves being able to read or write or do basic math before starting school, but it's really about the development of the whole child. It refers to their social and emotional skills, physical skills, communication skills, and cognitive skills. Children are more likely to thrive at school if they have already developed skills, such as getting along with others, following instructions, and communicating their needs.

These skills are often referred to as developmental milestones.

Some examples of 'school readiness' skills include:

- Play and social skills: Being able to play independently as well as with other children.
- Emotional maturity: Being able to manage their emotions, separate easily from parents or caregivers, focus on tasks, follow direction, and understand rules.
- Communication skills: Being able to talk with and listen to others, speak clearly, communicate needs, understand stories, and begin to identify letters.
- Learning skills: Developing basic number sense, problem-

- solving, planning, and sequencing.
- Physical abilities and coordination: For example, being able to grip a pencil, use scissors, confidently run, climb, and play ball.
- Independence: Development of basic skills such as going to the toilet, dressing, and eating lunch independently.

Play is very important, it's how children at this age learn and develop social, emotional, and problemsolving skills. Creative play, including unstructured playtime, can help with social skills and language, as well as motor skills. Play games together which will help kids practice turn-taking, waiting, and coping with not winning.



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t just twenty-five minutes and 40 RMB from either Shanghai or Hongqiao Stations, this is one of the easiest day trips for weekenders out there. And with all trains now using e-tickets you can scan through to your seats in no time at all-don't forget those passports! Suzhou has several arrival stations but aim for the oldest and most central, simply named Suzhou Station.

Suzhou's soul lies in the oldest part of town. Look on any map and you'll see the outline of a moat along which a city wall once ran. Hop in a taxi and by pass the congested tourist zones in the north, asking the driver to take you to Fengmen Hengjie in the southern part of the old town where street life rules supreme.

This centuries-old alleyway is a great area in which to get to grips

with Suzhounese food culture. The city's cuisine emphasises gentle, fresh flavours and the variety of produce here is genuinely astounding. Each morning, throngs of locals weave between towering heaps of fresh veggies to select the best of the bunch. See if you can pick out unique local favourites like jitoumi (gorgon fruit), used in seasonal soups, that stallholders sell from their doorways along with other regional specialties like bamboo and jellyfish.

From here cross the canal and head along Baibu Jie on foot. This cobbled street leads through some of the city's quietest and most elegant alleyways, crisscrossed by stone bridges and lined by weeping willows. It also offers a glimpse of the historic Soochow University campus, one of the most elegant in China and home to many handsome historic buildings.

Continue along the canal and you'll quickly see the Twin Pagodas looming into sight. These dramatic towers have stood in place for over a thousand years and are surrounded by a peaceful garden packed with relics from the Buddhist temple that once stood on this site. It's a great place to chill out



for a few moments and well worth the 8 RMB ticket to enter.

Next to the pagodas lies one of modern Suzhou's best little treats. Until recently, Shuangta Market was your average caichang where locals shopped for groceries, but a 2019 makeover gave it interiors that an art gallery would be jealous of and attracted the city's young hipsters. These days, alongside ayi selling veg and seafood, you'll also find buskers, noodles bars, and naturally, a gourmet coffee shop for that much-needed espresso. The people watching is wonderful here and it's the perfect lunch spot if you hit it at the right time.

You are now within strolling distance of Pingjiang Road, Suzhou's scenic tourist area in which it is easy to while away an afternoon in cool cafes and little boutiques. Those looking for a little more adventure, however, should hop in a cab for a short ride towards Yipu or the Garden of Cultivation as it is sometimes known in English.

Perhaps Suzhou's most underrated garden, locating it is part of the fun.



Challenge your kids to navigate the maze of ancient alleyways to the entrance by following the Chinese characters stencilled onto the whitewashed walls as you peek into resident's old courtyards and pass by old wells and bridges. The garden itself is a compact delight, perfectly proportioned and with an open-air teahouse that offers a relaxing and photogenic view back over the pond and huge lilies.

You could head from here back to Suzhou Station and shuttle back to Shanghai in less than half an hour, but why not make a weekend of it?



Hopping in a cab and zipping over to Jinji Lake in twenty minutes will give you a look at the modern side of the city. This immaculate area is home to Suzhou's booming tech scene as well as its swankiest hotels and malls. A glimpse of the vast Gate to the East tower (or Big Pants, as it is more appropriately and amusingly known by locals) that dominates the area will leave you in no doubt that this is a thoroughly modern metropolis that means serious business.

Looking for a little luxury? Well in that case the swish new Park Hyatt is your pick, offering all the mod cons vou would expect. Opened in June this year, the interiors here feature fab contemporary takes on traditional Suzhou garden designs elements like beautiful bonsai trees and ponds full of plump koi carp. The Chinese restaurant, Xizhou Hall, is already one of the most sought-after in town, known for its refined take on local classics. China, it has to be said, is not always a place where the old and new sit so easily next to one another but Suzhou seems to have found the recipe to blend the two seamlessly.

Glossary

ACT: A standardised test for high school achievement used in the United States assessing student learning in English, Mathematics, Reading, Science, and Writing. An alternative to the SAT for college applications.

American Curriculum: AUS curriculum based on Common Core State Standards for the core subjects English Lanugage Arts, Math, History and Geography, and Sciences.

Advanced Placement (AP): These are exams for senior students run by a US-based College Board. AP aims to emulate first year college courses, enabling high school students to earn college credit.

AP Capstone: AP diploma programme built on the AP Seminar and AP Research, designed to complement in-depth, discipline specific study provided through the AP courses.

British Curriculum: Follows the National Curriculum of England where all learning materials are produced in the UK. It culminates with the IGCSE and A-Level certification in secondary school.

Council of International Schools (CIS): The CIS awards schools that ensure high educational standards, and a focus on infusing an international and intercultural perspective into their programmes. It takes one to two years of self-assessment before schools can be accredited.

CITA: The Commission on International and Trans-Regional Accreditation is a USrun agency that enforces internationally recognised high educational standards in its schools.

EAL/EFL/ESL: These programmes offer assistance for students learning English as a second language, with half or full-day programmes and individual tutoring during non-school hours.

High Scope Curriculum: Emphasises a hands-on approach to learning in early child-hood education. Eight content areas provide its Key Developmental Indicators.

IB (PYP) (MYP) (DP): The International Baccalaureate Programme includes Primary Years, Middle Years, and Diploma Programmes. IB fosters critical thinking, problem solving, research, and writing skills. The DP requires six courses, Theory of Knowledge (philosophy), and a 4,000-word extended essay. The IBDP is accepted in college applications worldwide.

IGCSE: The International General Certificate of Secondary Education is taken between the ages of 14 and 16. Students are required to study core topics along with a select number of over 70 optional topics. Typically, qualified students move on to study AP or IB and occasionally A-Levels.

IPC: The International Primary Curriculum aims to instill in children a desire to learn by focusing on three aspects of subject matter: knowledge, skill, and understanding.

Montessori: Theory of education characterised by freedom within limits, thus facilitating the development of the child's independence. Methods focus on the child's natural learning process, honed by independently working with materials rather than direct instruction.

NEASC: The New England Association of Schools and Colleges is a US-based organisation which helps international schools adhere to publicly stated standards and objectives.

NCCT: The National Centre for School Curriculum and Textbook Development is a non-governmental agency for schools seeking both international and Chinese accreditation. The NCCT helps to develop and assess school curricula, textbooks, and teaching methods.

SAT: An aptitude test used in the US for college applications. A newly revamped SAT released in Spring 2016 includes changes to scoring and testing content. The test comprises three parts: Evidence-based Reading, Writing and Language, Maths, and an optional Essay.

TOEFL: Test of English as a Foreign Language assesses English proficiency. International students applying to English speaking universities are required to take the TOEFL exam.

WASC: The Western Association of Schools and Colleges is an American organisation that assesses and accredits schools that successfully undergo a six-year accreditation process.
