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UNIQUELY CHINA

THE TRADITIONAL INFLUENCE ON MODERN TASTES

hina is a country that has a rich history and culture, and tapping into that is becoming more and more popular.

The national trend or *guochao* (国潮) movement is all about embracing traditional Chinese culture elements in modern life. Its influence can be seen in the clothes that are in fashion, the brand of beauty product you use, and how you spend leisure time.

It is a continuation of the new Made in China push that started in the 2010s, but by 2022 the movement has grown and evolved, proving its staying power and strong roots in shaping the modern Chinese identity.

Heritage in the Modern Era

In fashion, the *guochao* movement has evolved into Neo Chinese Fashion (新中式), which is characterized by the subtle incorporation of Chinese elements such as modern dresses with frog buttons, or using traditional patterns and fabrics.


Foreign brands have chosen to collaborate with Chinese artists as one way to pay homage to the national culture.

Another expression of *guochao* is supporting home grown Chinese brands. Chinese sportswear brand Li-Ning is held as a leading example of *guochao*. The brand burst onto the scene with its successful 2018 line of patriotic-styled gear.

Embracing heritage can also be seen in the restoration of historic buildings in Shanghai. One such example is the Prada Rongzhai building in Jing'an. The mansion was originally built in 1918 as the residence of industrialist Rong Zongjing. After Prada restored the building, it opened in 2017 as an event and gallery space.

But a country with as rich and as long a history as China is hard to master for a newcomer. *Guochao* needs to be authentic to resonate with its audience and succeed.

to be appreciated and savored leisurely in a social atmosphere. Great care is taken in preparing and selecting the best quality leaves, with a premium aged *pu'er* tea brick recently fetching a record high in the million RMB range.

Comparable to the variety of wine grapes, factors like the harvest time, the age, and the climate all affect the taste and character of tea leaves. Visit one of Shanghai's tea market (Tianshan Tea City: 518 West Zhongshan Road) to meet vendors that can teach you how to appreciate tea the Chinese way.

Age Old Wisdom

Interest in Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) drives the growth of the Chinese beauty market, also called C Beauty. Look to recent popular interest in jade rollers and guasha among worldwide beauty influencers. These two TCM methods are ancient practices of facial care to help stimulate circulation and exercise the facial muscles.

TCM's influence is also seen in the ingredients of beauty products. Take Shanghai brand Herborist as an example. The brand infuses natural ingredients know for their specific benefits like jujube and goji berries. Recently Sephora started promoting C Beauty brands including Herborist through its international network, making the products available in new countries.

Another Sephora brand partner is Cha Ling. The Sino-French brand is owned by LVMH and also uses TCM wisdom in the formulation of its products. Ingredients like *pu'er* tea boasts anti-oxidant properties and represents the *cha* (tea) in Cha Ling.

The identity of modern China is constantly being written, and a pride of the past guides the future.

The Old is New Again

Stove-boiled tea is the latest fad in the slow living and *guochao* trends. It involves tea leaves that are roasted on a grill before being slow boiled on a charcoal stove. According to Jing Daily, the fad comes from tea practices of ethnic minorities in Yunnan Province and is similar to the ancient way of making tea during the Ming Dynasty in the 14th Century. The stove-boiled tea method adds a camping and Do-It-Yourself flare to tea culture.

China's teahouse culture has a prominent place in traditional and modern culture. Tea is meant

Wah is a familiar name in the Shanghai property development scene. Founded in 1955 in Hong Kong, the company has had a presence in the Chinese mainland for 30 years since 1992. The veteran investment group has developed notable projects like the K. Wah Centre on Middle Huaihai Road, the Stanford Residences serviced apartments in Jing'an and Xuhui, along with Grand Summit, The Palace, Navale, and EDGE, the commercial development.

As K. Wah looks forward to the next 30 years, the company's projects are focused on modernizing with the times. It is doing that by understanding the consumer and staying ahead of market trends. This can be seen in the recent co-living CITTA Residence and urban revitalization project WYSH.

Eugene Tang, general manager of development and operations, keeps a sharp eye on what the future brings.

"I like to people watch," said Tang. "Predict what they like or do in the future."

A large part of his job is to know what will be popular in two years, the time it takes from conceiving a new development to its completion.

Art and Urban Revitalization at WYSH A recent trend in Shanghai's real estate develop-

ment is a shift to urban revitalization, which repurposes the city's wealth of historic architecture.

"It's different from Hong Kong. There are no more historic buildings everywhere. Everybody took them all down," said Tang.

"Shanghai has a lot of high quality historic buildings. Because it was such an international city back then in the 1920s, they had the best people around the world to build them. So, to be part of it, to revitalize them is very important."

The new WYSH site is a section of the larger Changning District government's plan to revitalize all of Wuyi Road. The historic cornerstones of the WYSH development are the former site of FEILO Acoustics Factory that was the first to be listed on the Shanghai Stock Market.

WYSH is designed to cater to the arts with wide-open gallery space for art exhibitions and fashion shows. Other K. Wah properties have already partnered with notable luxury brands to hold events at EDGE located on Suzhou Creek, as well as at Palace Lane.

Vertical landscape will be a distinguishing architectural feature of WYSH. It will make use of the elevated roof space with outdoor staircases and ramps to connect the rooftops with seating areas.

WYSH will also follow the lead of past projects by keeping a keen eye on which partner brands to welcome into the development. At K. Wah Centre there is the popular dining space Liquid Laundry, and exercise chain Will's Gym. Also, Palace Lane on West Jianguo Road has Pain Chaud Bakery and the iYouth fashion boutique. According to Tang, when it comes to finding partners, it's all about identifying the customer, and what aligns with their needs.

Social Living at CITTA Residences

A change is happening in residential real estate, following the lead of new consumer demands and lifestyles. Modernization means co-living. The movement caters to a younger demographic of single professionals, and is characterized by upscale apartments with shared common space of a kitchen, lounges, laundry, gyms, and reception. The goal is to foster community and socialization that is missing from traditional multi-family living options, along with the high quality and management service absent from standard rentals.

K. Wah's answer to the co-living market need is CITTA Residences, which opened in 2021 in Jing'an District. Tang describes it as a turnkey solution, with each room fully furnished and the flexibility of short-term contracts.

"Stanford Residences is the mother brand. The demographics are usually families with kids," said Tang. "Maybe it's not so suitable for younger people. So we created the CITTA brand."

Keeping the needs of its target audience in mind, CITTA boasts community-building events like themed activities for residents, along with easy access to public transportation on the metro. The company plans to expand the brand with more locations in the future.

K. Wah in the Yangtze River Delta Area

Currently underway in Nanjing is a project familiar to Chinese megacities, the multi-purpose retail mall, office buildings, and residential apartments. The large development spans an impressive 700,000 sqm in Nanjing's up and coming Jianye District, with a scheduled grand opening date of 2028.

Phase one of the project is the residential portion, Sierra, is underway with 11 high-rise towers housing a total of about 856 apartment units. Most units are 3 or 4-bedroom, making it a good fit for families.

To round out the project, the residential towers will be accompanied by a hotel, three towers of office buildings, and a commercial mall. K. Wah will continue its dedication to art by again collaborating with UCCA Center for Cotemporary Art to welcome its fourth museum. UCCA already has a museum at EDGE in Shanghai.


The diverse Nanjing mega intergrated development is the first to bring together all of the property elements in K. Wah's repertoire.

"I've done everything by itself in Shanghai. But Nanjing is the first one where we can do it all at once," said Tang. "For us, if you ask what's in the future, its more of that."

K. Wah has shown its commitment to the Yangtze River Delta Area with investment for the last 30 years and looks forward to continued development for decades to come.

After graduation, Dr Lui joined Yew Chung International School (YCIS) directly and served as a Chinese Language Teacher in the Primary and Secondary sections, Chinese Language Curriculum Development Officer, Head of Teaching and Research, Chinese Principal of Primary and Secondary Schools in YCIS Hong Kong, Head of Chinese Language Curriculum Studies and Secretary General of the Yew Chung Cultural Committee during his 30-year career.







ounded in 1932, Yew Chung (YC) Yew Wah (YW) celebrates its 90th anniversary this year. As the first international school in Shanghai officially registered and recognised by the Chinese government, YCIS Shanghai has a deep educational heritage, which fosters confidence and innovation.

Dedicated to Diversifying Education

YCIS Shanghai has a long tradition of implementing the objectives of holistic education with an emphasis on character education. Dr Lui believes that a holistic approach produces comprehensive excellence instead of narrow mastery. Parents choose YCIS because they believe in the school's philosophy and values for their child's education and an interview with the parents is required during the application process.

Dr Lui believes that people are similar, so when cooperating and solving problems, we should have empathy and compassion toward others. As long as there are common goals and compatible ideals, dissimilarities, including language and culture, can be understood and overcome.

A Unique Learning Journey International education is about building on one's



roots to understand and absorb the best in other cultures. This absorption requires a confident command of one's mother tongue, which is why YCIS Shanghai has always emphasized Chinese language learning for students. In his research, Dr Lui believes that Chinese is not only a language but also a carrier of Chinese culture. Dr Lui and his colleagues have been teaching Chinese for decades, and YCIS Shanghai's Chinese language curriculum is distinctive, which leads to a high standard of language learning and a unique characteristic of YCIS students.

Dr Lui emphasizes text analysis in his language teaching, allowing students to form thoughts as they read and write, and to appreciate the logic behind the use of Chinese words and phrases. This language practicum develops adaptable thinking skills. Dr Lui claims one of the greatest achievements is how "Our students don't just learn a language, they learn with language and think with language, and now we have expanded this platform further, not just for our language classes, but for all our subjects."

The new Bilingual Learning Community model nurtures just that. "We divide language learning into three important categories. The first step is to learn the language. The second step is to learn with the language, and the third step is to learn about the language," explains Dr Lui. When the students have instruction in two languages simultaneously, they inherently reach levels of language learning they would not normally attain in an isolated language class. Dr Lui explained the theory further, explaining how bilingual education is not simply about speaking two languages, but about being able to think in either language and flourish in the future work environment in either language. The curriculum and research that YCIS is doing breaks through the conventional limitations of education and nurtures interdisciplinary and intercultural talents.

Responsibility as Educators

The pandemic has changed the way many of us look at the world and has changed our daily experiences. We have all experienced things at a heightened level and more quickly than we may have expected without a global pandemic. At school, YCIS challenges students to be innovative and adaptable to many things and equip them with the skills and mindset to face the unforeseeable.

Further reflecting on the impact of the pandemic on the education of students, Dr Liu states, "Firstly, children should develop a growth mindset so that they can actively adjust and adapt to suit their environments. Secondly, they should have a flexible way of thinking to manage changes around them. Cultivating openness involves stepping out of the comfort zone, developing diverse interests and try-





ing out challenging things. A YCIS student's vision should be broadened to understand the world. It is also important to learn to get along with people and help each other and to develop a sense of compassion and a spirit of giving and service from an early age. After all, how you are treated by the world depends on how you treat the world."

Dr Lui thinks what society and parents can teach to children is critical. Nowadays, technology is changing fast, and knowledge has a short lifecycle. Considering this, we should lead children to learn values that will withstand the test of time instead of making students struggle to learn skills with short lifecycles. Dr Lui quotes from ancient Chinese philosopher Chuang Tzu who said what appeared useless at first sight turns out to be very useful. "A useless use is a great use." Students should be instructed in how to make the best use of such seemingly useless knowledge.

YCIS Shanghai's dedication to global education is paired with the vision to promote an inner moral compass. This critical balance will help to enable the next generation to navigate through human complexities and enable them to exhibit goodness, honesty and compassion. This obligation today will lead to a more stable world in the future. After all, it is the learning that will impact and transform the future.

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POWER SALAD

Ingredients:

1	Egg
1 tbsp	Olive oil
pinch of	Black pepper
pinch of	Salt
1 slice	Whole wheat bread
2 cups	Lettuce
1/2 cup	Cherry tomatoes
1/4 cup	Frozen sweet corn
1/4 cup	Blueberries
1/4 cup	Frozen pineapple pieces
1/2	Cucumber
1 tbsp	Balsamic vinegar

Sunny Side Up Egg on Toast Instructions:

1. Heat up frying pan on low heat and add olive oil to coat pan.

- 2.Crack egg into pan, do not stir. Cook until whites have solidified and yolk is still runny.
- 3. Toast bread slice. Remove egg with spatula and place onto toast. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Salad Instructions:

- 1. Wash and cut lettuce into bite size pieces, wash and halve blueberries and cherry tomatoes, wash and slice cucumber.
- 2.Defrost frozen sweet corn and frozen pineapple pieces.
- 3.Add all to a bowl and mix. Dress with balsamic vinegar.

TOMAHAWK STEAK

Ingredients:

1	Tomahawk steak	
1 tbsp	Coarse salt	
1 tbsp	Ground black pepper	
3 tbsp	Olive oil	

Instructions:

- 1. Store the steak at 0-4 for thawing 12 hours in advance, gently dry the surface of the steak with kitchen paper, evenly sprinkle salt and a little freshly ground black pepper on both sides, apply olive oil all over.
- 2.Heat the frying pan to high temperature, add olive oil, and sear the steak on both sides for 3-5 minutes. Make sure not to burn it. The sides are thick and need to be fried until it changes color.
- 3. Preheat the oven to 180 . Put the steak into the oven to cook for 15-20 minutes. Take it out and let it sit for 10-15 minutes to cool down. Then cut it into pieces, and the medium rare Tomahawk steak is ready to serve.





FRUIT BAGEL

Ingredients:

1	Cranberry bagel	
2 tbsp	Cream cheese	
1/2	Banana	
1 tsp	Honey	
pinch of	Ground cinnamon	

Instructions:

- 1. Cut bagel in half and put bagel into an air fryer or oven. Heat at 180 for 2-3 minutes.
- 2.Remove and let cool slightly. Spread cream cheese onto the bagel face.
- 3.Cut banana into slices and add onto bagel. Finish with a drizzle of honey and a dash of cinnamon on top.

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PREGNANCY AFTER AGE 35

UNITED FAMILY SHARES WHAT EVERY WOMAN SHOULD KNOW



he age for giving birth is later today than it was in generations before. United Family Obstetrics & Gynecology physician Jane Shen talks about the risks of pregnancy after 35 and gives suggestions on preparation and care for a healthy pregnancy even if mothers have had previous successful experiences.

How will a woman's physical condition change after 35? What risks will they face if they bear babies after 35?

Many women think that if they previously had successful deliveries, they would not have problems having kids over 35 either. But actually, there are risks that become more discussion-worthy at this age threshold, as physical conditions will naturally change. Here are some of the risks they may face.

1. Chromosome Abnormalities

Their eggs may not be in the best condition any longer and clinical research has found that babies born to older mothers have a higher risk of chromosomal abnormalities, such as Down's Syndrome. Here is a chart showing the incidence of Down's Syndrome for babies grows with the mothers' age.

Incidence of Down Syndrome for Babies	Age of Mothers
1:1,250	25
1:952	30
1:385	35
1:106	40
1:35	45

Therefore, it is always suggested that expecting mothers have pre-pregnancy check-ups and regular antenatal care at a hospital. If they have a history of miscarriage or embryo growth arrest, they should receive pre-pregnancy genetic tests together with their husbands to give their baby the best start.

2. Gestational Diabetes

Women over 35 also face a higher risk of developing gestational diabetes. This type of diabetes, which occurs only during pregnancy, is more common as women get older. Gestational diabetes can cause a baby to grow significantly larger than average, which may cause difficulty in delivery.

And those who have suffered gestational diabetes also have a 30 percent risk of developing Stage-II

Diabetes after 40 years old. Their children are also at a higher risk for diabetes as their pancreatic islets would have been overused as foetuses.

3. Reproductive Difficulties

Older women's eggs aren't fertilised as easily as younger women's eggs and they might need assisted reproductive technologies, such as in vitro fertilization (IVF). Women with a history of induced abortion are also at a higher risk of problems, such as placenta praevia and postpartum haemorrhage.

What preparations should couples make? 1. Pre-pregnancy check-up

Get a general pre-pregnancy check-up for possible problems, such as hypothyroidism, a condition resulting from decreased production of thyroid hormones. Untreated hypothyroidism can cause health problems including infertility.

2. Early folic acid supplements

Women over 35 should take folic acid three months before conception to prevent neural tube birth defects.

3. A healthy diet and regular physical activity

Women who prepare to bear babies should maintain a healthy and well-balanced diet and do regular physical activities to improve their health.

During pregnancy, it will be more difficult for expecting mothers to keep their weight constant, which might cause gestational diabetes and high blood pressure. So, starting with a reasonable weight level and health condition is a better choice.

4. No smoking or drinking

Both parents are advised to stop smoking or drinking at least three months before conception as these substances can easily cause maldevelopment or malformation of babies.

What is the appropriate pregnancy spacing?

The World Health Organization (WHO) suggests mothers wait at least 18 months after giving birth before trying to get pregnant again. It reduces the risks of complications such as miscarriage, preterm labour, gestational hypertension, or preeclampsia.

What should be done during pregnancy to ensure healthy growth of babies and the health of expectant mothers?

Like other pregnant women, women over 35 should eat a healthy diet, stay active and seek regular prenatal care.



1. During pregnancy, women need more folic acid, calcium, iron, vitamin D and other essential nutrients. So, eat a healthy diet.

2. Pregnant women still need to do physical activities to help ease or prevent discomfort and improve overall health to support the healthy growth of babies. It can also help prepare for childbirth by increasing your stamina and muscle strength.

It is suggested to exercise two or three times a week, without the risk of falling or overdoing it, such as quick walking, swimming, and yoga. Consult doctors for a list of recommended activities.

3. Prenatal check-ups are crucial. Mothers who have given birth before might think they can handle it by themselves, but many problems can only be found in medical examinations, such as placenta previa and gestational diabetes.

What is post-pregnancy care for mothers over 35?

Mothers should continue taking vitamins and additional calcium, as they did during pregnancy.

Besides the loss of nutrients in feeding babies, women older than 35 also face bone aging and need more supplements to fill in the gaps. Some women who suffered from postnatal haemorrhage may need an iron supplement. Therefore, food alone can't provide enough nutrients for nursing mothers and additional supplements are necessary.


